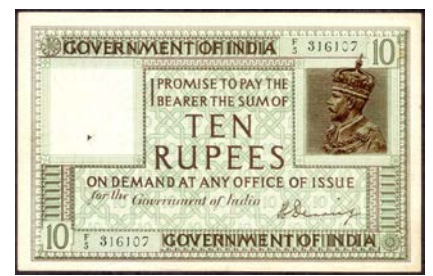

Jakhania Hoard type, **Silver Vimshatika**, Archaic period, Thick planchet, **Obv:** four punches consisting of pair of a circle with a whorled design, pair of geometric symbols with ancillary symbols, **Rev:** uniface, **4.61g, 24.01mm**, (Rajgor Series 55 # 739), about very fine, **Very Rare**.
Estimated Price: 10,000-15,000

Note: Planchet of this type is thicker than the usual Kashi coins.



2. **Silver Vimshatika**, Archaic period, ABCC type, **Obv:** four composite punches, including a circle with a whorled design, a composite geometrical design, a pair of geometric symbols and other ancillary symbols, **Rev:** various banker's marks, **4.6g, 32.7mm**, (Rajgor Series 55 # 740/Hardekar # KA 127), choice quality, about extremely fine, **Very Rare**.

13. **Silver Drachma, “Flower bed” type, Obv:** a deer standing to the right with a square-shaped vase above its back, an early Srivatsa symbol between its horns, the goddess Lakshmi stands on a lotus flower bed on the right field in front of the deer, facing forward, and holds a lotus flower with an upraised right hand, the Brahmi legend “**Rajnah Kunimdasya Amoghbbhutisya Maharajasya**” (Great king Amoghbbhuti, of The Kunindas) around the field, **Rev:** a centrally placed six-arched hill (chaitya) with parasol, a wavy river line below and a Nandipada (Triratna) above, Swastika above an Indradhvaja on the left field and a tree within railings on the right, the Kharoshthi legend “**(Rana Kunindasa Amoghbu)tisa Maharajasa**” (Great king Amogh, of the Kunindas) around the field, **2.0g, 17.07mm**, (JONS by S. 14. **Silver Drachma, “Flower pot/Peacock” type, Obv:** a deer standing to the right with a square-shaped vase above its back, an early Srivatsa symbol between its horns, the goddess Lakshmi stands on a Srivatsa on the right field in front of the deer, facing forward, and holds a lotus flower with an upraised right hand, a flower pot between the deer and the goddess (the JONS lists the symbol as a peacock), the Brahmi legend “**Rajnah Kunimdasya Amoghbbhutisya Maharajasya**” (Great king Amoghbbhuti, of The Kunindas) around the field, **Rev:** a centrally placed six-arched hill (chaitya) with parasol, a wavy river line below and a Nandipada (Triratna) above, Swastika above an Indradhvaja on the left field and a tree within railings on the right, the Kharoshthi legend “**(Rana Kunindasa Amoghbu)tisa Maharajasa**” (Great king Amogh, of the Kunindas) around the field, **2.1g, 18.77mm**, (JONS by S. Kumar 218 # Type V, Class-2/W. Pieper # 1141), choice very fine, **Very Rare**.

Note: This variant for the type is with the goddess Lakshmi standing on a Srivatsa and a flower pot/Peacock between the deer and the goddess.



15. **Silver Drachma, “Fire Altar, Pot & Nandipada” type, Obv:** a deer standing to the right with a square-shaped vase above its back, an early Srivatsa symbol between its horns, an inverted Nandipada is behind and a fire altar below the deer, the goddess Lakshmi stands on the right field in front of the deer, facing forward, and holds a lotus flower with an upraised right hand, a pot between the deer and the goddess, the Brahmi legend “**Rajnah Kunimdasya Amoghbbhutisya Maharajasya**” (Great king Amoghbbhuti, of The Kunindas) around the field, **Rev:** a centrally placed six-arched hill (chaitya) with parasol, a wavy river line below and a Nandipada (Triratna) above, Swastika above an Indradhvaja on the left field and a tree within railings on the right, the Kharoshthi legend “**(Rana Kunindasa Amoghbu)tisa Maharajasa**” (Great king Amogh, of the Kunindas) around the field, **2.3g, 16.75mm**, (Unlisted type), choice quality, about extremely fine, **Extremely Rare**.

This likely occurred in a region not yet assimilated into the Gupta realm, where Kushan dinars were widely accepted as the standard currency. However, S. Kumar offers a simpler explanation, attributing the coins to the Rajadanda-Scepter type. This is supported by the King’s attire resembling a tribal appearance and the presence of a Fire-Altar on these coins.

Note: It was believed previously that Rao Raydhanji II of Kutch was said to have issued this coin, in which he declared himself to be a 'Murid' (disciple) of a Sufi saint. The fact that it is struck in the name of Akbar makes this implausible since nearly 200 years separated Raydhanji and Akbar.

It is likely that 'Rai Singh', who struck these coins, is Raisingh Jhala, the ruler of Halwad (Dhrangadhra). In 1566, during the third year of Raisingh's reign, Raisingh was fatally wounded in the battle of Malia. His infant son Chandrasingh was proclaimed king in his place. Raisingh, however, appears to have survived the battle because he is known to have had an audience with Akbar about 20 years later at Fatehpur Sikri. As soon as Raisingh secured Akbar's confidence, he returned to Halvad between January and March 1585, regaining the throne from Chandrasingh through Abdur Rahim Khan, the governor of Gujarat. The time he spent at Akbar's court would have a long term impact on his subsequent reign. When Muzaffar III rebelled, the local rulers of Kathiawad formed alliances with the warring parties. Jam Satrasal (Sataji) of Nawanager allied himself with Amin Khan Ghorī, who was the de facto ruler of Junagadh during the revolt. It is believed that they were Muzaffar III supporters. In accepting the Mughal sovereignty, Raisingh Jhala took the side of the Mughals. Raisingh Jhala's subservience is emphasized on these coins by the word "murid", which is translated as "a servant."
