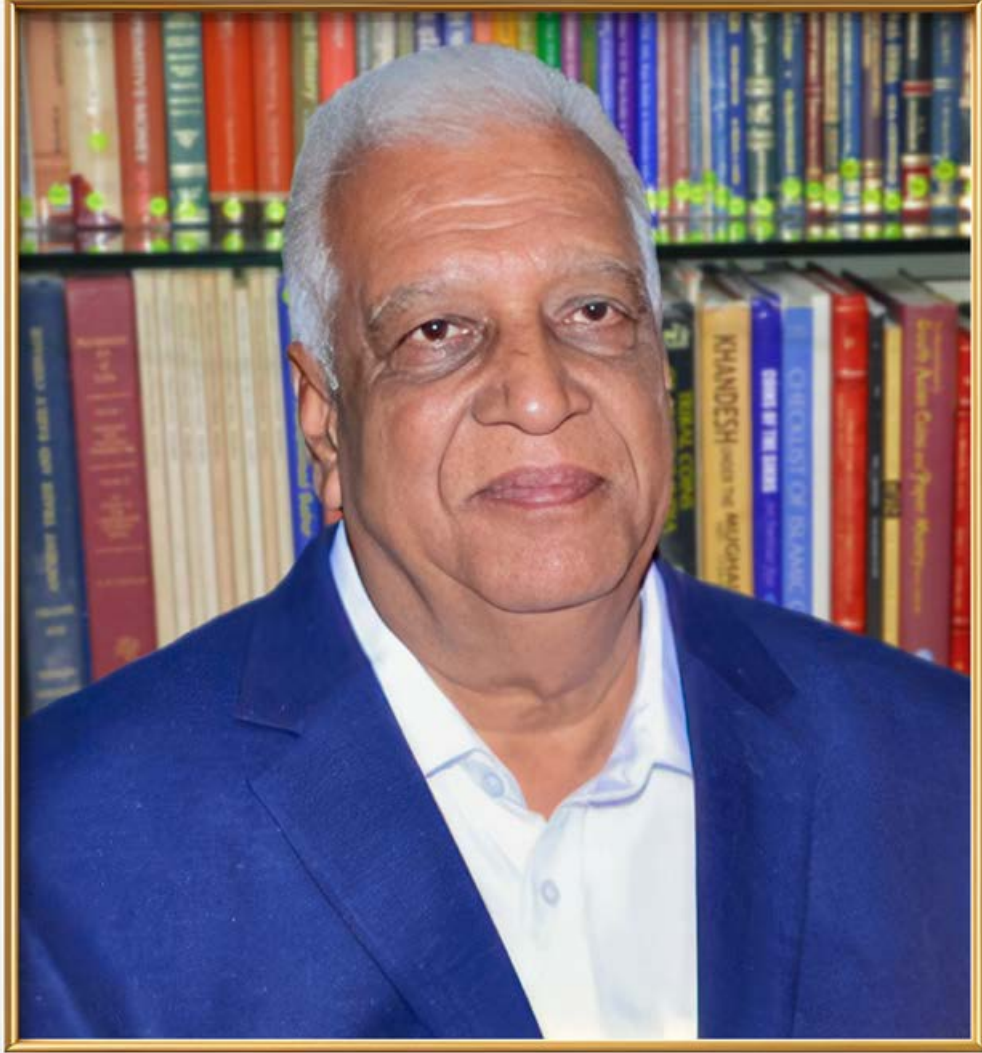

## Late Shri. Prem Ratan Maru

### A Tribute to the Legacy of the Visionary Founder of India's Only Three-Generation Numismatic and Philatelic Auction House

**Late Shri. Prem Ratan Maru**, born on 7<sup>th</sup> **June 1948** in Bikaner (Rajasthan), to the Army Veteran **Late Shri. Jethmal Ji Maru**, was a man who nurtured a profound passion for philately, numismatics, and intellectual pursuits. Following in the noble footsteps of his father, who bravely served in **Basra** (Iraq) during **The World War II**, as part of the **Bikaner State Army**, Prem Ratan Ji grew up absorbing values of discipline, patriotism, and unwavering dedication to both family and Nation.

From a very young age, Prem Ratan Ji demonstrated an insatiable curiosity for learning. His interests in studies, history, astronomy, astrology and philately began when he was just a child. At the tender age of 10, his fascination with stamps sparked a passion for collecting a hobby that soon blossomed into a lifelong pursuit. What began as a child's curiosity became a powerful force that shaped his life.

In the early years of his career, Prem Ratan Ji opened a small shop named **Madhu General Store on Mahatma Gandhi Road in Bikaner**. Over time, his keen eye for detail and his growing collection of stamps and coins, combined with his love for literature and intellectual exploration, led to the *foundation of Novel Emporium*, a thriving business that became a treasure trove for philatelic and numismatic enthusiasts. **Novel Emporium** was not merely a place of commerce but a hub for knowledge, attracting scholars, researchers, and collectors alike.

Beyond his entrepreneurial success, Prem Ratan Ji was an active journalist throughout his life. He published a daily newspaper and contributed thought-provoking columns on a wide range of subjects to various publications. His writing reflected his deep engagement with society and his unrelenting quest for knowledge.

As a man of scholarship, Prem Ratan Ji became not only an avid collector but also an author, publishing numerous research articles in national and international journals. His profound knowledge of postal history, particularly of British India and the Indian Princely States, helped uncover several historical discoveries. His contributions to philately and numismatics gained him recognition both in India and abroad, and he became a respected figure among collectors, guiding many to build award-winning collections.

In 1965, he married **Madhu Devi**, daughter of **Late Shri Nemichand Ji** of **Sardarshahar** (Churu District), who stood by his side through every phase of life. Together, they nurtured a family rooted in the values of hard work, integrity, and service to society. Prem Ratan Ji was blessed

with Three sons, Three daughter-in-laws, and Seven grand children. His progressive ideals were exemplified through the dowry-free marriages of all his children. He was also blessed with seven grandchildren, and his legacy of love, equality, and wisdom continued to flourish through them.

Prem Ratan Ji's impact extended far beyond his business endeavours. He was a mentor, guide, and scholar who enriched the lives of not just his family but also the wider community. His children and grandchildren were deeply inspired by his commitment to learning, discipline, and the pursuit of knowledge. For him, philately was not just a business; it was a scholarly endeavour that ignited the curiosity of researchers, students, and fellow enthusiasts alike.

Even in his later years, Prem Ratan Ji's commitment to excellence never wavered. His passion for philately, numismatics, and his family remained the guiding lights of his life. Through his dedication, he placed Bikaner on the global map of philatelic and numismatic circles. His generous guidance to fellow collectors earned him worldwide respect, and his legacy of learning continues to inspire future generations.

On **26<sup>th</sup> July 2024**, Prem Ratan Ji passed away, leaving behind a rich legacy of knowledge, discipline, and inspiration. Though he may no longer be with us in person, his spirit continues to guide those who knew him. His remarkable journey from a curious young boy to a global icon in philately will forever be remembered by all who had the privilege of crossing paths with him.

We honour our beloved father and a founder with the highest respect and gratitude. His life serves as a shining example of unwavering commitment to his passions, his family, and his values. In all that we do, we strive to uphold the legacy of integrity, excellence, and honour that **Late Shri Prem Ratan Maru** Ji has left for us to follow.

**Today Prem Ratan Ji is no longer with us, the passion and love for collecting that he inspired in countless hearts will live on forever.**

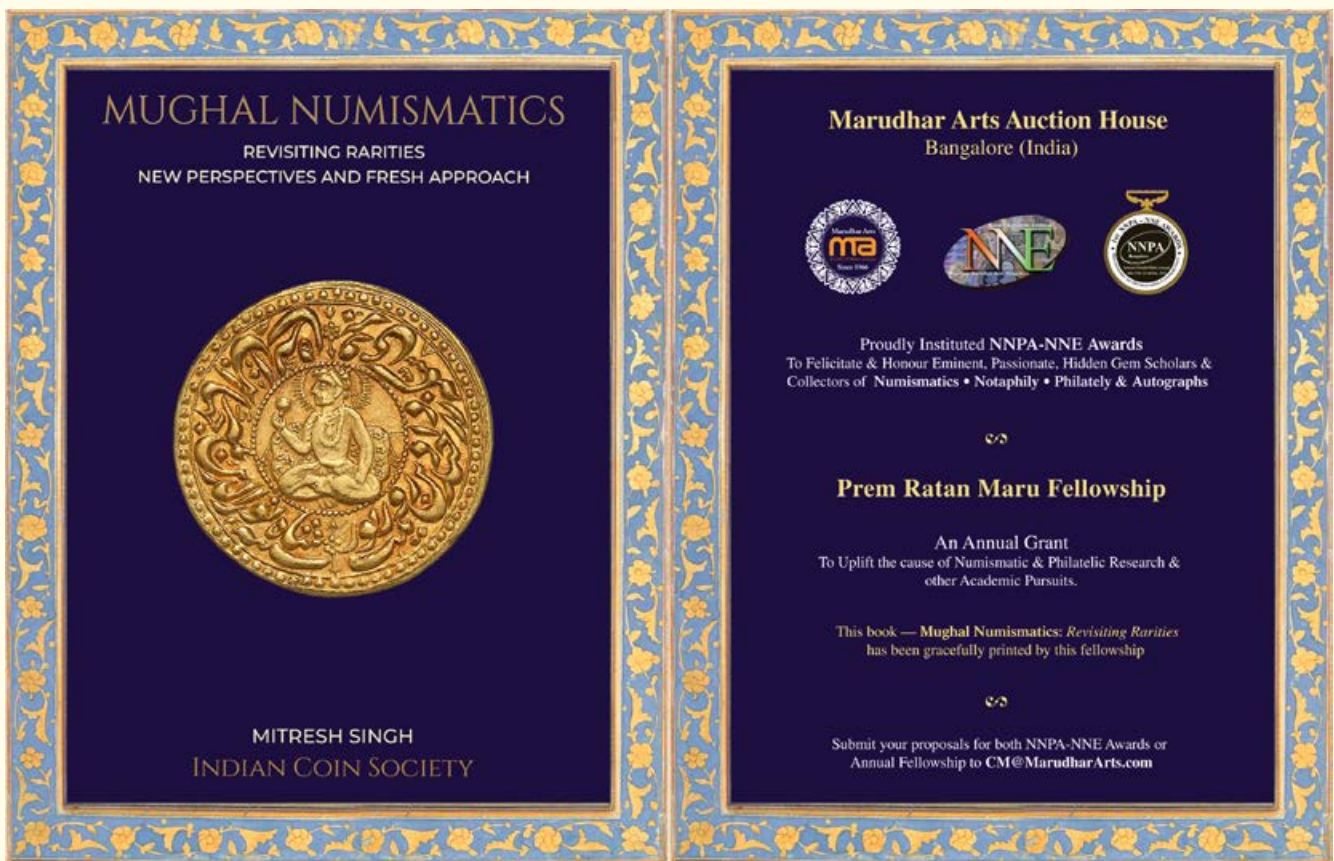


## The Prem Ratan Maru Fellowship

Auctioneer also reserves the rights:

## Coins of Ancient India

## Harappan Primitive Money (3000-2500 BC)



1. Indus Valley Civilization, **Gold Disk (3)**, Group of 3 Disks, various sizes with a central hole, generally used for necklaces but allegedly also for trade, given the great variety of size & weight, known from excavations at Harappan sites, **0.05 to 0.13gms, 2.9 to 4.98mm**, *about extremely fine*, **Extremely Rare**.

**Estimated Price:** 10,000-12,000

**Note:** A pair of gold disk-shaped beads similar to those found in the Muzaffarnagar district of Uttar Pradesh in the Mandi hoard. With serrated edges, they are delicately manufactured. It is widely believed that they date back to the Harappan period around 2000 BC, making them one of the oldest precious metal jewelry components found in India. It is likely that they served both as a means of exchange as well as a means for storing value.

2. Indus Valley Civilization, **Gold Disk/ Earring**, with a central hole, coin like edge and opening for wearing in the ear, generally used for Earrings but allegedly also for trade, given the great variety of size & weight, known from excavations at Harappan sites, **2.8g, 28.55mm**, *mud deposits on the surface, about extremely fine*, **Extremely Rare**.

## Vedic Primitive Bead Money (1000-100 BC)



3. **Ancient**, Consisting of **5 Beads, Jasper Beads** in various sizes with a central hole, beads used as nishka for jewellery and for barter, probably from Ujjaini area, **0.6 to 2.21g**, *about extremely fine*, **Very Rare**.

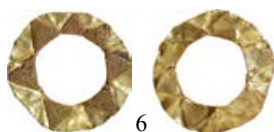
4. **Rigvedic Period, Disk of Copper with Gold Gilt**, disk with concentric circles, coin like, used as barter, **8.37g, 25.4mm**, *with mud deposits on the surface, about very fine*, **Very Rare**.

5. **Rigvedic Period?, Lead Alloy Copper Earrings**, Earrings facial details are finely modelled, ancient jewellery used as barter, ear ornaments with decoration, **16g each approx., 21.3x31mm each approx.**, *good quality, about very fine*, **Extremely Rare**.

6. **Rigvedic Period, Gold Disk**, 7-point star with central hole, perhaps used for barter as primitive money, **0.46g, 16.49mm**, *good quality, about extremely fine*, **Very Rare**.

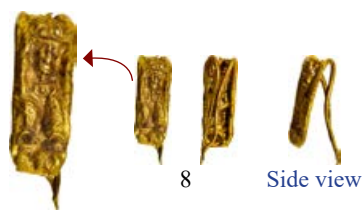

7. **Rigvedic Period, Gold Pendant**, Pendant in heart/inverted spade shape with a pearl attached at the end, ancient jewellery used as barter, ornaments with decoration, **0.6g, 14.35x22.05mm**, *good quality, about extremely fine*, **Very Rare**.

8. **Rigvedic Period, Gold Pin**, Pin with deity symbol (Lord Vishnu?), ancient jewellery used as barter; ornaments with decoration, **0.75g, 5.14x14.4mm**, good quality, about extremely fine, **Very Rare**.

9. **Rigvedic Period, Gold Mukut with Ruby**, Gold mukut artistically designed with a ruby inserted in the center; ancient jewellery used as barter; **1.5g, 6.7x9.58mm**, about very fine, **Rare**.

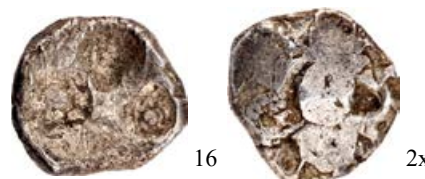

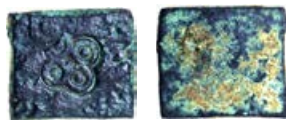

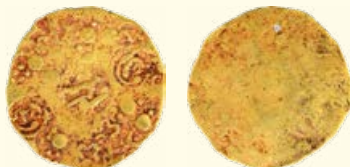

Jaunpur issued coins in AH 936, as evidenced by the surviving coinage.

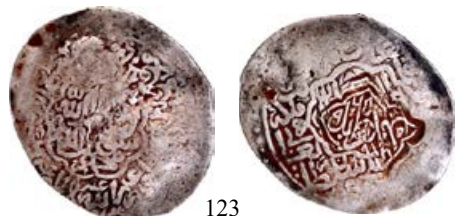

However, Akbar strategically recaptured the nearby fort of Hajipur, which served as a critical supply source for Daud’s army. This decisive move shattered the morale of Daud’s troops, forcing them to retreat to Bengal. Following the victory, Akbar appointed Munim Khan as governor of both Bihar and Bengal, with Todar Mal serving as his deputy. Akbar then returned to the Mughal capital, solidifying his control over the region.

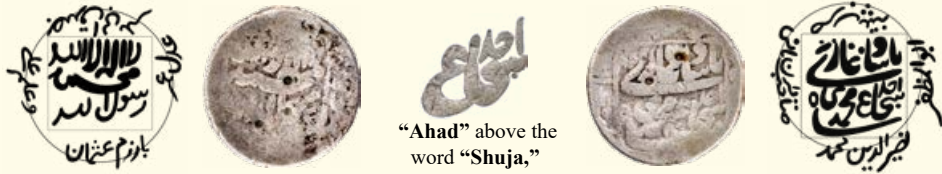

It was erroneously thought these coins were issued in the name of “Moran,” a courtesan, leading to the Morashahi designation. An article in the *Journal of Oriental Numismatic Society* clarified that the symbol is actually a Ber sprig. As a result, “Ber Shahi” will now be used for coins with this symbol, which likely entered circulation in VS 1862.

**Note:** Kutch, an erstwhile princely state in India is the largest district of the state of Gujarat. Deshalji I was succeeded by his son Lakhpatji. The reign of Lakhpatji I is often considered to be glorious in the North despite the ambitions of the Marathas, the Rohillas, and the courtiers of the Mughal court all clashing to result in an otherwise turbulent period. A key player in this was Ahmad Shah Durrani, the Afghan ruler who desired to recover his claim on the Mughal subahs of Kashmir, Sindh, and Punjab. His expedition to upper Sindh in 1752 had already sounded alarm bells in Kutch. Probably as a measure to pacify the highly feared Shah, Lakhpatji resorted to striking coins in his name, thereby nominally acknowledging his sovereignty. It is interesting to note that the date on these ceremonial coins is AH1169, which is a year before Ahmad Shah’s 4th invasion of India during which he occupied Delhi and staged a massacre at Mathura. Perhaps, Lakhpatji was being very cautious about the Shah’s intentions, which is a rare instance of political sagaciousness shown by a weak but prosperous ruler to save his skin in View of an impending crisis.
